Explain and critically evaluate Socrates' account of justice in the city as presented in Plato's Republic

- The first question is "what is justice?" Socrates addresses this question both in terms of political communities and in terms of the individual person or soul. He does this to address the second and driving question of the dialogue: "is the just person happier than the unjust person?" or "what is the relation of justice to happiness?"

- Socrates considered the distinct subjects such as theories of justice, for example, views of human happiness, education, the nature and importance of philosophy and philosophers, knowledge, the structure of reality, the Forms, the virtues and vices, good and bad souls, good and bad political regimes, the family, the role of women in society, the role of art in society, and even the afterlife.
