The Dark Rationalism Glossary

Abstract

Existential theorists have been working to syncretize philosophy, science, and spirituality since shortly after Galileo unknowingly initiated the schism between them. Contemporary philosophers, scientists, and theologians are still engaged in this effort, but have little to show for nearly four centuries of effort. The thesis of this article is that—despite their cooperative intentions—these theorists continue to talk past each other, due to an unacknowledged disagreement on the meaning of their overlapping terms of art. To effectively unify the divergent existential insights of philosophy, science, theism, and spirituality, it will be necessary to return to first principles. To establish an integration baseline, this article defines a diverse collection of philosophical, scientific, theistic, and spiritual expressions, in a unifying vocabulary.

The Glossary of Terms

Note: The <u>underlined</u> terms in each definition are explained elsewhere within this glossary.

- Acceleration The <u>material expression</u> of any <u>changes</u> <u>identified</u> in the angle between the directions of actual <u>translation</u>—through <u>time</u>—of an inertial <u>observer</u> and an <u>observed manifestation</u>, which em<u>bodies</u> inverse <u>changes</u> in the magnitude of the latter's rate of actual <u>translation</u>.
- Adaptation The <u>emergence</u>, within a <u>vital body</u>, of a new, <u>environment</u>-reflecting <u>intention</u> as an <u>identifiable cause</u> of <u>life</u>sustaining <u>effects</u>. The <u>vital</u> analog of <u>memory</u>.
- Analysis The <u>identification</u> of <u>information</u> and simple <u>knowledge</u> within complex <u>knowledge</u>.
- Anger A mental incarnation's experience of its body's impatience with its separation from that with which it desires to connect.
- Angst A <u>mental incarnation</u>'s <u>experience</u> of its <u>body</u>'s impatience with its <u>separation</u> from that with which it <u>aspires</u> to <u>connect</u>. Anxiety.
- Appearance An <u>incarnation</u>'s <u>experience</u> of a <u>phenomenon</u>.
 Also see Essence, Phenomenon, Truth.
- Art Any practice that <u>aspires</u> to <u>express</u> wisdom by revealing <u>beauty</u>.

- Aspiration The <u>will</u> to <u>transcend</u>, rather than simply pursue, an <u>imperative</u> or <u>intention</u>.
- Asymmetric mind A configuration of <u>self-awareness</u>, <u>consciousness</u>, and self-<u>expression</u>, with <u>inexistential</u>, <u>objective</u>, and <u>subjective</u> aspects, that share it as their <u>identity</u>, in their unified pursuit of <u>perfect symmetry</u>.
- Asymmetry domain Any portion of a <u>symmetry domain</u>, whose contents are <u>distinguish</u>able in the context of its <u>emergent</u> <u>attribute</u>s.
- Attribute An <u>identifying asymmetry</u> of a <u>being</u> or <u>category</u>.
 To <u>categorize</u> an <u>entity</u> as contextualizing a specific <u>asymmetry</u>.
- Awareness The <u>capacity</u> to <u>identify entities</u>.
- Beauty (objective) The <u>categorization</u> of <u>manifestations</u> whose <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, or <u>aspirations</u> are <u>identified</u> as increasing the <u>symmetry</u> of a predecessor <u>incarnation</u> of their <u>inherently conscious observer</u>.
- Beauty (subjective) The <u>degree</u> of a <u>being</u>'s <u>harmony</u> with the <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspirations</u> of its <u>manifest conscious</u> <u>observer</u>. The <u>identifier</u> of the path to <u>wisdom</u>.
- **Being** An <u>entity identified</u> within <u>existence</u>. <u>Existing</u> with an <u>identified asymmetry</u>.
- Belief A <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>expression</u> of an <u>idea</u> as apparent <u>truth</u>. Also see Truth.

- Bliss The <u>transcendence</u> of <u>happiness</u> and <u>pleasure</u>.
- Body An <u>entity</u>'s self-<u>expression</u> within another <u>domain</u>. The actual self-<u>expression</u> of the outermost, inward-facing surface of an <u>objective identity</u>—through <u>material operands</u> in its <u>world</u>— as an inertial <u>manifestation</u>, whose transitive <u>expression</u>s are <u>identified</u> as <u>either</u> its apparent <u>incarnation</u>s or the <u>causes</u> of other <u>effects</u> in its <u>world</u>.
- Body (mental) Any inertial <u>manifestation</u>, with an <u>essential</u> <u>aspiration</u> that is <u>identifiable</u> as a <u>cause</u> of <u>changes</u> in its self-<u>identifying configuration of possibilities</u> using its <u>awareness</u> of this <u>aspiration</u> in other <u>mental manifestations</u> within its <u>world</u>, to <u>compassion</u> ately shape their mutual <u>growth</u> toward <u>complete</u> <u>self-awareness</u>.
- Body (temporal) Any inertial <u>manifestation</u>, with an <u>essential</u> <u>imperative</u> that is <u>identifiable</u> as a <u>cause</u> of <u>changes</u> in its self-reflecting configuration of <u>possibilities</u>, using the <u>energy</u> <u>separating</u> it from <u>temporal symmetry</u> to <u>translate</u> in that direction.
- Body (vital) Any inertial <u>manifestation</u>, with an <u>essential</u> <u>intention</u> that is <u>identifiable</u> as a <u>cause</u> of <u>changes</u> in its self-<u>distinguishing</u> configuration of <u>possibilities</u>, that <u>evolve</u> its <u>adapted capacities</u> to <u>instinct</u>ively shape <u>life</u>-sustaining <u>effects</u> toward an <u>environment</u> in which it <u>self-perpetuates</u>.

- Capacity Any <u>manifestation</u>'s use of its access to its <u>unmanifest</u> <u>objective identity</u>'s self-<u>expression</u> within it, to pursue an <u>imperative</u>, <u>intention</u>, or <u>aspiration</u>.
- Category A <u>domain</u> of <u>entities</u> that are <u>identified</u> as sharing an <u>attribute</u>. Also see Space.
- Causal translation (body) To have a <u>past</u> encompassing merging <u>complementary</u> asymmetries.
- Causal translation (incarnation) To <u>experience</u> the aligning of <u>effects</u> with imperatives, intentions, or aspirations.
- **Causality** The <u>identification</u> of the <u>transformation</u> of <u>possibility</u> into <u>certainty</u>, as a consequence of the use of <u>energy</u>.
- **Cause** The <u>observer-identified</u> <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspirations</u> with which an <u>effect</u> is most <u>symmetric</u>ally aligned.
- Certainty The <u>degree</u> to which the <u>effects</u> that <u>emerge</u> from an <u>indeterminacy</u> are determined by its <u>observer</u>'s <u>objective</u> <u>identity</u>. Any distinct <u>possibility</u> that either has <u>manifested</u> (positive) or can never <u>manifest</u> (negative), within a given <u>world</u>.
- Change Any <u>observed material manifestation</u>'s <u>transformation</u>, which is the apparent em<u>bodiment</u> of its <u>translation</u> through <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental indeterminacies</u> <u>separating observer-sequenced</u>, <u>tangible metrical space</u>s. To be <u>temporalized</u>, <u>vitalized</u>, or <u>mentalized</u>.

- Charge A body's material capacities, whose expression into the space around it, is a field—the local sub-space whose operators transitively express its imperatives, intentions, and aspirations.
- Charge (mental) A <u>body</u>'s <u>willful capacity</u> to shape <u>indeterminacies</u>, <u>express</u>ed as its <u>thoughts</u> and <u>emotions</u>, which are <u>identifiable</u> as <u>causes</u> of <u>transformations</u> of <u>possibilities</u> into <u>certainties</u>, in accordance with its <u>aspiration</u> to <u>grow</u> toward <u>complete self-awareness</u>. A <u>conscious body</u>'s <u>personal values</u>.
- Charge (temporal) A <u>body</u>'s <u>causal capacity</u> to shape <u>indeterminacies</u>, <u>express</u>ed as bosonic interactions, which are <u>identifiable</u> as <u>causes</u> of <u>transformations</u> of <u>possibilities</u> into <u>certainties</u>, in accordance with its <u>imperative</u> to <u>translate</u> toward a <u>world</u> in <u>temporal symmetry</u>.
- Charge (vital) A body's self-centered capacity to shape indeterminacies, expressed as its instincts, which are identifiable as causes of transformations of possibilities into certainties, in accordance with its intention to adapt toward self-perpetuity. A living body's genome.
- Collective unconscious The world observed by the inexistential identity that is common to all inherently conscious observers. The noumenon that is analogous to Kant's

<u>transcend</u>ental <u>imagination</u>. Also see **Universal consciousness**, **Imagination**.

- **Compassion** Any <u>expression</u> of <u>empathy</u> that em<u>bodies love</u>.
- **Complementary** Any configuration of <u>asymmetric entities</u> whose <u>symmetry</u> increases as their <u>separation</u> decreases.
- Complete self-awareness The <u>perfect symmetry</u>, which encompasses every <u>conceivable possibility</u>, and is hidden by the self-<u>attributed uniqueness</u> of each <u>asymmetric mind</u>. Selfless <u>awareness</u>. Also see **Perfect symmetry**, **Real mind**, **Reality**.
- Conceivable Residing within the <u>world</u>, the <u>inherent</u> <u>consciousness</u>, or the <u>inexistential identity</u> of any <u>asymmetric</u> <u>mind</u>. Not <u>necessarily existing</u>.
- Connection The relationship between <u>entities</u> <u>identified</u> within the same <u>category</u> (<u>asymmetric</u>), or that <u>transcend</u> <u>categorization</u> (<u>symmetric</u>).
- Consciousness The <u>objectively internalized</u> and <u>subjectively</u> em<u>bodied</u> portion of an <u>inexistential identity</u>'s <u>complement</u> that <u>distinguishes</u>, <u>names</u>, <u>sequences</u>, <u>counts</u>, <u>temporalizes</u>, <u>vitalizes</u>, <u>mentalizes</u>, and <u>attributes meaning</u> to <u>beings</u> it <u>observes</u>. The basis of the <u>aspiration</u> to <u>grow</u> into the <u>real mind</u>.
- Count To <u>identify</u> the cardinality of the members of a given <u>category</u>, residing within a <u>metrical domain</u>.
- **Courage** The <u>capacity</u> to resist <u>fear</u> and <u>hatred</u>.

- Creativity The <u>capacity</u> to increase the <u>symmetry</u> of <u>knowledge</u>, which is <u>express</u>ed as enhancing its <u>utility</u>.
- Curiosity The <u>mental intention</u> to reveal <u>beauty</u> by decreasing <u>ignorance</u>.
- Current (extrinsic) The apparent <u>translation</u> of <u>charged</u> <u>matter</u> through <u>material space</u>, whose rate <u>changes</u> embody inverse <u>changes</u> in its rate of actual <u>translation</u> through <u>time</u>.
- Current (intrinsic) The torque of the apparent <u>rotation</u> of <u>charged matter</u> within <u>material space</u> that is the em<u>bodiment</u> of its actual <u>translation</u> along its <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental geodesics</u>.
- Dark Rationalism The school of <u>existential thought</u>—based on the premise that <u>reality</u> does not have to be <u>observed</u> to be <u>explained</u>—that uses <u>reflection</u> to <u>metaphysically</u> extend <u>physical theories</u>, in order to generate <u>logical conjectures</u> <u>explaining philosophical</u>, <u>scientific</u>, and <u>spiritual mysteries</u>, concerning the fundamental nature of <u>reality</u> and our role in it.
- **Death** The cessation of an <u>incarnation</u>'s <u>predictable</u> divergence from its <u>temporal geodesic</u>.
- Degrees (metrical) A <u>space</u>'s constituents that can be <u>identified</u> as greater than, equal to, or less than each other, based on the cardinality of <u>quanta</u> within the collinear <u>displacement</u>

that its <u>operators</u> <u>express</u> as <u>separating</u> each of them from its unit of size. <u>Countable</u> elements.

- Degrees (sequential) A space's constituents that can be identified as greater than, equal to, or less than each other, as determined by their relative position with respect to its minimum endpoint—or any maximum endpoint—based on which reside between the others and the endpoint. Uncountable collinear elements.
- **Desire** Any <u>expression</u> of a <u>vital imperative</u> to <u>translate</u> toward a <u>causal</u> <u>body</u>, with the <u>intention</u> of <u>internalizing</u> its <u>usable</u> <u>energy</u>, for shaping <u>adaptations</u> toward <u>self-perpetuity</u>.
- Despair The <u>hopeless awareness</u> of the ultimate futility of <u>imperatives</u> and <u>intentions</u>. Also see Equanimity.
- Destiny Each temporal, vital, or mental manifestation's transcendence of its identifying capacities, imperatives, and intentions. Also see Origin.
- Devotion A body's mental intention to sustain the object of its desire, which is experienced as infatuation.
- **Displacement** A <u>unique entity</u>'s <u>expression</u> within a <u>space</u>, through the application of its <u>operators</u> to its contents.
- Distance The <u>displacement</u> of a <u>material</u>, <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, or <u>mental space</u> through each <u>observing body</u>'s <u>expression</u>, and transitive application, of <u>operators</u> to its <u>matter</u>.

- Distinguish To informationally identify a being as a specific manifestation.
- **Domain** A collection of <u>entities</u>.
- Doubt A mental manifestation's experience of a separation between a <u>belief</u> and the <u>truth</u>. <u>Personal skepticism</u>. Also see Skepticism.
- Dynamics (mental) Each <u>asymmetric mind</u>'s <u>aspiration</u>al use of <u>mental energy</u> to <u>connect all conscious manifestation</u>s within its <u>world</u>, and <u>translate</u> each of them toward <u>complete self-</u> <u>awareness</u>, against opposition from nonaligned <u>imperatives</u> and <u>intentions</u>.
- Dynamics (temporal) <u>Matter</u>'s <u>imperative</u> use of <u>temporal</u> <u>energy</u> to <u>connect</u> to or <u>separate</u> from <u>temporal manifestations</u> within its <u>world</u>, as it <u>translates</u> toward <u>temporal symmetry</u>, against opposition from nonaligned <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspirations</u>.
- Dynamics (vital) Each <u>lifeform's intentional</u> use of <u>vital</u> energy to <u>connect</u> to or <u>separate</u> from <u>temporal</u> and <u>vital</u> <u>manifestations</u> within its <u>world</u>, as it <u>translates</u> itself toward <u>self-</u> <u>perpetuity</u>, against opposition from nonaligned <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspiration</u>s.

- Education Any practice that aspires to increase the <u>effectiveness</u> of a <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>intelligence</u> and <u>creativity</u>. Also see Indoctrination.
- Effect A <u>change</u> <u>identified</u> as aligned with a <u>body</u>'s imperatives, intentions, or aspirations.
- Elegance The <u>utility</u> of <u>beauty</u>.
- Emergence The <u>identification</u> of an <u>entity</u> as having crossed the boundary into an <u>asymmetry domain</u>, from its encompassing <u>symmetry domain</u>. The hiding of a <u>symmetry</u>. Also see Transcendence.
- Emotions The embodiments of a mental manifestation's intuitions, imperatives, intentions, aspirations, and memories, as inertial operators that determine the shape of its local mental space. Mental mass.
- Empathy A <u>conscious</u> <u>observer</u>'s extension of its <u>self-awareness</u> into other <u>entities</u>.
- Energy Any <u>dynamic operators</u> of a <u>causal space</u>—whose <u>observer</u> expresses itself in their distribution within its <u>present</u> <u>space</u>, and <u>distance</u> from the <u>past spaces</u> of their <u>operands</u>—that are <u>identified</u> as <u>translating</u> their <u>operands</u> through the <u>indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> <u>observer-sequenced</u>, <u>tangible</u> <u>metrical spaces</u>. The <u>capacity</u> to <u>sequence tangible spaces</u>.

- Energy (mental) Any <u>dynamic operators</u> that are <u>expressions</u> of the <u>objective identity</u> that <u>mentally</u> shapes a <u>world</u>, or of its em<u>bodiment</u> therein, and are <u>identifiable</u> as, <u>connecting</u> its <u>consciousness</u> to every <u>mental operand</u> in its <u>world</u>, and <u>translating</u> them through the <u>indeterminacies separating</u> each of them from <u>complete self-awareness</u>. A <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>thought</u>s.
- Energy (temporal) Any <u>dynamic</u> <u>operators</u> that are <u>expressions</u> of the <u>objective identity</u> that <u>temporally</u> shapes a <u>world</u>, or of its em<u>bodiment</u> therein, and are <u>identifiable</u> as <u>connecting its incarnation</u> to the <u>temporal operands</u> <u>displacing</u> its <u>causal space</u>, to <u>translate</u> it through the <u>indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> it from <u>temporal symmetry</u>. Elementary bosons.
- Energy (vital) Any <u>dynamic operators</u> that are <u>expressions</u> of the <u>objective identity</u> that <u>vitally</u> shapes a <u>world</u>, or of its em<u>bodiment</u> therein, and are <u>identifiable</u> as <u>connecting</u> its <u>living</u> <u>body</u> to all <u>vital</u> <u>operands</u> in its <u>environment</u>, to use them to <u>translate</u> itself through the <u>indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> it from <u>self-perpetuity</u>. A <u>vital manifestation</u>'s <u>heritable</u> instincts.
- Engineering The <u>practice</u> of shaping <u>effects</u> whose transitive <u>effects</u> are <u>intended</u> to satisfy <u>imperatives</u> or fulfill <u>intentions</u>. <u>Mentality</u> in the service of <u>vitality</u>. Also see Technology.

- Entanglement The reciprocal <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental</u> <u>connections</u> formed by <u>objective identities</u> <u>observing</u> interactions among their <u>subjective identities</u>, within their respective <u>world</u>s, from which their shared <u>universe emerges</u>.
- Entertainment The <u>category</u> of <u>experiences</u> that are <u>intended</u> to direct their <u>observer</u>'s focus away from its <u>stress</u>es.
- Entity Any <u>conceivable possibility</u>.
- Environment The <u>material space</u> to which a <u>manifestation</u> is <u>causally connected</u>.
- Equanimity The <u>moral awareness</u> of the ultimate futility of <u>imperatives</u> and <u>intentions</u>. Also see **Despair**.
- Essence The <u>expression</u> of an <u>observed</u> <u>being</u> by its <u>observer</u>'s <u>objective identity</u>. Also see **Appearance**, **Phenomenon**, **Truth**.
- Essential complement The <u>domain</u> that <u>uniquely reflects</u> a given <u>essence</u>, and with which it merges to reveal <u>reality</u>.
- Evil The self-centered <u>categorization</u> of any <u>being</u> that a <u>mental</u> <u>incarnation</u> <u>identifies</u> as <u>separating</u> its <u>body</u> from that with which it <u>needs</u> or <u>desires</u> to <u>connect</u>. Also see **Suffering**.
- Evolution The sharing of <u>mutations</u> within isolated populations of <u>vital incarnations</u>, which cooperatively <u>express</u>es each of their <u>bodies</u>' <u>intention</u> to <u>translate</u> toward <u>self-</u> <u>perpetuity</u>. The <u>vital</u> analog of <u>growth</u>.

- Existence The <u>domain</u> containing everything <u>necessitated</u> by the <u>uniqueness</u> of an <u>inexistential entity</u>.
- Experience Any <u>observation</u> of a <u>being</u> that <u>identifies</u> it as a <u>cause</u> of <u>changes</u> in an <u>incarnation</u> of the <u>observer</u>.
- Explanation The <u>transformation</u> of <u>information</u> into <u>objective</u> <u>knowledge</u>.
- Expression [Self-] An entity's [entire] reflection that emerges from operators within a space or domain it shapes. Also see Information, Knowledge.
- Externalize An <u>observer</u>'s <u>identification</u> of a <u>being</u> as distinct from its <u>identity</u>. Also see **Observation**.
- Fact An <u>idea</u> that is a constituent of an <u>epistemological</u> <u>framework</u>.
- Faith A <u>belief</u> whose <u>justification</u> is a <u>mystery</u>.
- Fear The <u>mental imperative</u> to <u>translate</u> away from an <u>identified</u> source of <u>suffering</u>.
- Field Any <u>material operand</u>'s <u>expression</u> in its local <u>space</u> through either, <u>tangibility</u>-reflecting <u>mass</u> <u>operators</u> that inertially shape this sub-<u>space</u>, or <u>charge</u>-reflecting <u>energy</u> <u>operators</u> that can <u>dynamically translate</u> each of their relatably <u>charged operands</u> through specific <u>indeterminacies separating</u> <u>observer-sequenced</u>, <u>tangible metrical spaces</u>, using <u>operations</u> determined by the <u>charge</u> of the source <u>operand</u>.

- Field (dynamic) Any <u>charge</u>'s <u>expression</u> in its local <u>space</u>, as
 a sub-<u>space</u> whose <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, or <u>mental energy operators</u>
 are <u>identifiable</u> as transitively <u>expressing effects</u> that align the
 other <u>causally</u> relatable <u>charges</u> within it, with specific
 <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, or <u>aspirations</u> of the source <u>operand</u>—
 which is <u>experienced</u> as exerting <u>forces</u> on the other <u>operands</u>.
- Field (inertial) Any <u>matter</u>'s <u>expression</u> in its local <u>space</u>, as

 <u>material</u> sub-<u>space</u> shaped by its <u>mass</u> <u>operators</u>, which are
 experienced as exerting force on all other matter within it.
- Force Any use of <u>energy</u> that is <u>experienced</u> as a <u>cause</u> of <u>changes</u>, in the shape of the probability distribution within the <u>indeterminacies separating</u> the <u>observer-sequenced</u>, <u>tangible</u> <u>metrical spaces</u> that are accessible to each specifically <u>charged</u> <u>operand</u> within a given <u>field</u>, in alignment with the <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, or <u>aspirations</u> of its relatably <u>charged</u> source.
- Framework (epistemological) A configuration of <u>facts</u> assembled in accordance with the <u>mental intention</u> to <u>identify</u> the <u>truth</u>. An <u>appearance domain</u> in which specific <u>facts</u> are <u>express</u>ed as <u>truth</u>.
- Framework (existential) A configuration of <u>wisdom</u> assembled in accordance with the <u>aspiration</u> to <u>explain reality</u>.
- Free will The self-<u>identification</u> of a <u>mental manifestation</u>, as having the <u>capacity</u> to choose—independently of the shaper of

its <u>world</u>—which <u>unmanifest</u> <u>possibility</u> in a <u>causal</u> <u>indeterminacy</u>, <u>manifests</u> as a <u>certainty</u>.

- Frustration A mental incarnation's experience of its body's impatience with its separation from that with which it needs to connect.
- Future The <u>temporal identification</u> of the <u>inherent</u> <u>consciousness</u> of an <u>objective identity</u>, by its <u>subjective identity</u>, and all other <u>mental manifestation</u>s within the <u>world</u> it shapes. Also see Past, Present.
- Genius The creative intelligence from which wisdom emerges.
- Geodesic (mental) Any <u>conscious</u> <u>incarnation</u>'s shortest <u>aspiration</u>-shaped path through the <u>mental</u> <u>indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> it from <u>complete self-awareness</u>. The <u>moral</u> path.
- Geodesic (temporal) Any <u>causal incarnation</u>'s shortest <u>imperative</u>-shaped path through the <u>temporal indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> it from <u>temporal symmetry</u>; any <u>predictable</u> divergence from this path <u>identifies</u> the <u>incarnation</u> as also <u>being</u> <u>alive</u> or <u>conscious</u>. The path of least resistance.
- Geodesic (vital) Any <u>living incarnation</u>'s shortest <u>intention</u>shaped path through the <u>vital indeterminacies separating</u> it from <u>self-perpetuity</u>. The path to fulfillment.

- God An <u>identification</u> of the all-encompassing <u>real mind</u>—
 which <u>transcends</u> both <u>uniqueness</u> and <u>consciousness</u>; and of the
 <u>unique universal consciousness</u> it encompasses; and of each

 encompasses its <u>uniqueness</u>; and of its self-<u>expression</u> as the
 interiority of a distinct <u>subjective identity</u>, which <u>manifests</u> as a
 <u>sequence of conscious bodies</u> within the <u>world</u> it shapes. The
 most <u>persistent</u> of the <u>spirits</u> that are <u>identified</u> as <u>conscious</u>,
 whose <u>conceivability</u> or apparent embodiments are the
 justification of the beliefs that <u>identify</u> their followers.
- Gratitude A <u>conscious observe</u>r's <u>expression</u> of an <u>observe</u>d <u>manifestation</u>'s <u>beauty</u>. Prayer or worship.
- Growth The transformation of consciousness into greater selfawareness, which is subjectively experienced as the increasing empathy that reveals the path to <u>bliss</u>.
- Guilt A <u>mental manifestation</u>'s self-<u>identification</u> as a <u>cause</u> of an <u>incarnation</u>'s <u>separation</u> from that with which it <u>needs</u>, <u>desires</u>, or <u>aspires</u> to <u>connect</u>.
- Habit Any practice that is an expression of a recurring imperative. Also see Meditation, Ritual.
- Happiness Any <u>incarnation</u>'s satisfied <u>experience</u> of a lack of <u>need</u> for <u>change</u>, which is its <u>body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of a decrease in its <u>temporal stress</u>. Also see **Pleasure**.

- Harmony <u>Symmetric</u> alignment.
- Hatred A mental body's expression of its impatience with any being that it identifies as persistently separating it from that with which its incarnation needs or desires to connect.
- History The temporal portion of the world expressed by an unmanifest observer that any of its manifest predecessors experienced. Also see Future, Past, Present.
- Hope Any <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>awareness</u> of its <u>destiny</u> to <u>transcend</u> its <u>origin</u>.
- Human condition (the) The growth of hominids—a distinct category of mental incarnations—through their body's conflicting intuitions, imperatives, intentions, and aspirations, which will end with their transcendence of their origins.
- Hypothesis A justifiable opinion.
- Idea An <u>expression</u> of <u>intuition</u>.
- Idealism The school of <u>philosophical thought</u> that is based on the premise that the <u>logical consistency of reality</u> has a <u>mental</u> foundation.
- Identify To <u>attribute</u> an <u>identity</u> to an <u>entity</u>.
- Identity The <u>name</u> that <u>identifies</u> an <u>entity</u>.
- **Ignorance** The <u>separation</u> between a <u>mental manifestation</u> and <u>objective knowledge</u>, in which its <u>doubt</u> resides.

- Imagination The self-<u>expression</u> of an <u>objective identity</u> within the <u>consciousness</u> of its <u>subjective identity</u>'s <u>bodies</u>, as their interiority—which em<u>bodies</u> their <u>mental capacities</u>.
- Imperatives The tendencies of a <u>causal body</u> to be <u>identified</u> as using the <u>energy</u> of its <u>world</u> to align <u>effects</u> with <u>needs</u>.
- Impossible The <u>existential categorization</u> of any <u>entity</u> that can never <u>manifest</u> in the <u>world</u> of a given <u>objective</u> <u>observer</u>, which collectively em<u>body</u> the <u>observer</u>'s <u>inexistential identity</u>.
- Incarnation The actual <u>expression</u>, in the <u>world</u> of an <u>objective identity</u>, of the self-<u>expression</u> of its predecessor. The apparent self-<u>expression</u> of a <u>body</u> as a <u>dynamically charged</u> <u>manifestation</u> that <u>emerged</u> from <u>experiencing</u> the <u>expressions</u> of certain relatably <u>charged</u> <u>bodies</u> within its <u>material space</u>.
- Incarnation (mental) A distinct <u>being</u>'s <u>manifestation</u> that <u>displaces</u> from the <u>emergence</u> to the cessation of <u>consciousness</u> within its <u>temporal</u> or <u>vital body</u>.
- Incarnation (temporal) A distinct <u>being</u>'s <u>manifestation</u> that <u>displaces</u> from the <u>emergence</u> to the consumption of all <u>usable</u> <u>energy</u> within the <u>environment</u> of its <u>material body</u>.
- Incarnation (vital) A distinct <u>being</u>'s <u>manifestation</u> that <u>displaces</u> from the <u>emergence</u> to the termination of <u>life</u> within its <u>temporal body</u>.

- Indeterminacy Any <u>material possibility</u> from which multiple, mutually exclusive <u>certainties</u> can <u>emerge</u>.
- Indoctrination Any practice that intends to constrain a mental manifestation's intelligence and creativity to a specific epistemological framework. Also see Education.
- Inexistence The <u>asymmetry identifying every entity</u> residing beyond <u>existence</u>.
- Inexistential identity The portion of an <u>observer</u> that em<u>bodies</u> every <u>entity</u> that can never <u>manifest</u> within its <u>world</u>. Any <u>entity</u> whose <u>uniqueness</u> <u>necessitates</u> the <u>existence</u> of all other <u>entities</u>.
- Information The <u>observer-reflecting separations</u> that fundamentally <u>distinguish</u> the <u>manifestation</u> of an <u>observed</u> <u>being</u>. The <u>asymmetry</u> of <u>knowledge</u>. Also see Knowledge.
- Inherent consciousness The possibilities within the unmanifest objective identity of an asymmetric mind—the portion of its inexistential identity's complement that it internalized—residing beyond the manifest world it shapes through essential reflection. A noumenon that is analogous to Husserl's pure consciousness.
- Instincts <u>Vital</u> intentions.
- Instincts (adapted) The em<u>bodiments</u> of a <u>vital</u> manifestation's imperatives and intentions as inertial operators,

that are <u>identified</u> as <u>adaptation</u>s that determine the shape of its local <u>vital space</u>. <u>Vital mass</u>.

- Instincts (heritable) The embodiments of a vital manifestation's imperatives and intentions as dynamic operators that are identified as translating it, through the indeterminacies separating the vital spaces sequenced by its objective identity. Vital energy.
- Intelligence The <u>capacity</u> to <u>transform</u> <u>information</u> into <u>knowledge</u>.
- Intentions A body's vital or mental imperatives, whose work is based on predictable divergences from its temporal geodesic, and therefore are identified as decreasing the vital and mental energies it uses to pursue its desires.
- Internalize An <u>observer</u> extending its <u>identity</u> to encompass an observed entity.
- Intuition A <u>subjective identity</u>'s <u>mental</u> access to the original—though <u>conceivably</u> ir<u>rational</u>—ideas in its <u>objective</u> identity's self-<u>expression</u> within its <u>consciousness</u>. The use of <u>imagination</u>.
- Joy A <u>conscious</u> <u>observer</u>'s <u>experience</u> of an <u>observed</u> <u>manifestation</u>'s <u>beauty</u>.
- Justice The <u>identifying categorization</u> of any <u>work</u> aligned with decreases in a <u>conscious body</u>'s <u>separation</u> from that with

which it <u>aspires</u> to <u>connect</u>. Each <u>being</u>'s <u>purpose</u>. Also see **Vengeance**.

- Justification The alignment of an <u>idea</u> with a specific <u>epistemological</u> or <u>existential framework</u>.
- Knowledge The <u>observer</u>-reflecting <u>connections</u> by which <u>observed beings are mentally internalized</u>. The <u>asymmetry</u> of <u>information</u>. Also see **Information**.
- Law of science A theory that codifies regularities in the probability distribution of the <u>effects</u> that can be <u>experienced</u> by the successors to the <u>observer</u> of a <u>recurring causal</u> indeterminacy. The <u>rational identification</u> of a <u>spirit</u>. Also see Spirit.
- Life The rhythmically recurring <u>imperative</u> of any <u>temporal</u> <u>body</u> that <u>express</u>es its <u>vital intention</u> to <u>adapt</u> toward <u>self-</u> <u>perpetuity</u>, through the use of <u>energy</u> it extracts from its <u>environment</u>. The <u>meaning</u>less interplay of <u>need</u> and <u>desire</u>.
- Logic A <u>rational epistemological framework</u> that aligns <u>ideas</u> with <u>facts</u>, and premises with conclusions.
- Logical enlightenment The <u>wisdom aspired</u> to by any <u>framework</u> in the <u>Dark Rationalism</u> school of <u>existential</u> thought.
- Love The <u>empathic experience</u> of increasing proximity to <u>completeness</u> that is shared by <u>complementary conscious beings</u>

as their <u>separation</u> decreases. The <u>identifier</u> of the <u>aspiration</u>al path of <u>asymmetric mind</u>s.

- Lust A body's vital intention to obligate the object of its desire to its incarnation's translation toward self-perpetuity. The vital analog of infatuation.
- Manifestation The <u>categorization</u> of any <u>entity</u> that <u>exists</u> within the <u>world</u> of an <u>observer</u>.
- Mass Any <u>tangible metrical space</u>'s inertial <u>operators</u>, which <u>materially distinguish</u> their <u>operands</u>—whose distribution is an <u>expression</u> of its <u>observer</u>—by transitively <u>expressing</u> the kinematic size and shape of the <u>material distance separating</u> them.
- Material space The sequence of observer-related, tangible metrical spaces, through which matter is identified as having apparently translated, and in which the torque of its apparent rotation is the embodiment of its ongoing actual translation along its temporal, vital and mental geodesics. A world's appearance domain, which embodies all of its changes.
- Mathematics The <u>practice</u> of <u>identifying sequences</u>, <u>operators</u>, and <u>operand</u>s.
- Matter A <u>space's metrical</u> constituents whose <u>separations</u> are <u>distances</u>, transitively <u>expressed</u> by its <u>observer</u> through its <u>operands</u>. Any <u>operands</u> of a <u>world's mass operator</u>—which

<u>express</u>es them as <u>displacing</u> a <u>tangible metrical space</u>—or of its <u>energy operators</u>, whose <u>expressions</u> of them embody the <u>current</u> that is <u>identified</u> as <u>translating</u> them through the <u>indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> <u>observer-sequenced</u>, <u>tangible</u> <u>metrical spaces</u>.

- Meaning The difference that an <u>observed being</u> can make in the <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspirations</u> of its <u>conscious</u> <u>observer</u>.
- Measurement An <u>objective</u> record of an <u>experience</u>.
- Meditation Any practice that is an expression of a conscious observer's aspiration to generate or sustain its equanimity, by limiting its frustration, anger, and angst—its incarnation's experiences of its body's impatience with its separation from that with which it respectively needs, desires, and aspires to connect. Also see Habit, Ritual.
- Memory A <u>conscious observe</u>r's <u>perspective</u> that em<u>bodies</u> its <u>awareness</u> that the <u>past exists</u>, and contained <u>possibilities</u> whose <u>transformations</u> into <u>certainties</u>, shaped what it <u>identifies</u> as its predecessor <u>manifestation</u>s. <u>Conscious</u> access to a <u>domain</u> of manifest certainties.
- Mentalize To identify a being as having memory, which embodies its awareness of its contingency upon causal

<u>indeterminacy</u>, through which its <u>body aspires</u> to <u>grow</u> toward <u>complete self-awareness</u>.

- **Metrical** <u>Count</u>able.
- Miracle An effect with no identified manifest cause.
- Modal idealism A <u>Dark Rationalism</u> framework that uses reflection to explain the nature of reality, and the structure of the mind, by <u>identify</u>ing the role of the latter, in the context of the former.
- **Moral** The <u>identifying categorization</u> of the <u>degree</u> to which <u>practices align with the <u>aspirations</u> of all <u>mental manifestations</u>.</u>
- Mortality A <u>body</u>'s <u>vital</u> <u>expression</u> of its <u>separation</u> from <u>self-perpetuity</u>. The basis of the <u>vital</u> <u>intention</u> to <u>evolve</u>.
- Mutation A <u>random heritable change</u> in a <u>vital incarnation</u>, <u>express</u>ed by its <u>body</u>'s <u>intention</u> to <u>translate</u> toward <u>self-</u> <u>perpetuity</u>.
- Mystery The <u>information</u> that <u>identifies</u> what cannot be <u>explain</u>ed.
- Mysticism The ir<u>rational belief</u> that there is <u>information</u> that can never be <u>explained</u>; which underlies the <u>mental imperative</u> to reveal the <u>beauty</u> of reality, in order to <u>identify</u> our role in it. The sanctification of <u>ignorance</u>, in a <u>theistic</u> context.
- Name The <u>identification</u> of the <u>domain</u> of <u>attributes</u> that fully <u>categorizes</u> an <u>entity</u>'s <u>asymmetry</u>.

- Necessary The <u>category</u> of <u>possibilities</u> whose <u>existence</u> is the em<u>bodiment</u> of their <u>observe</u>r's unique self-<u>identification</u> as a <u>complementary domain</u> of <u>impossibilities</u>—whose <u>inexistence</u> it also <u>identifies</u> as such.
- Need Any <u>expression</u> of a <u>temporal imperative</u> to use <u>energy</u> to <u>translate</u> toward a <u>world</u> in <u>temporal symmetry</u>.
- Noumenon Any <u>unmanifest entity</u> that <u>express</u>es itself in the <u>manifest certainties</u> of the <u>world</u> it <u>observes</u>. Also see Objective identity, Phenomenon, Spirit.
- **Objective** The <u>category</u> of <u>manifestations</u> with <u>world</u>wide <u>identity</u> invariance.
- Objective identity An <u>unmanifest observer</u> that <u>expresses</u> its <u>manifest world</u> through an <u>essential reflection</u>. A <u>noumenon</u> that is analogous to Kant's <u>transcend</u>ental ego. Also see Noumenon, Soul.
- Obligation An <u>externally-imposed imperative</u> or <u>intention</u>. The <u>work</u> of a <u>manifestation</u> that is <u>intended</u> to sustain that which <u>effectively lusts</u> for it, or to appease that which it <u>fears</u>.
- **Observation** An <u>entity</u>'s differentiation of a <u>being</u>, as distinct from it. Also see **Externalize**.
- **Operand** Any <u>manifestation</u> to which the application of an <u>operator expresses displacement</u> within its encompassing <u>space</u>.

- Operator An <u>essential identifier</u> of <u>translation</u>al or <u>rotation</u>al <u>displacement</u> within any <u>metrical space</u> whose <u>material</u> portion is a <u>transformation</u>al record of each <u>operand</u>'s actual <u>translation</u> through <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental space</u>. A <u>uniqueness identifier</u> that <u>reflectively</u> differentiates a <u>possible operand</u> from its perfect <u>complement</u>.
- **Opinion** The <u>expression</u> of an <u>idea</u> as <u>fact</u>.
- **Orientation** The configuration of <u>displacements</u> from a given manifestation to each of the beings within the space they share.
- Origin The <u>emergence</u> of a <u>being</u>'s <u>identifying capacities</u>, <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspirations</u>. Also see **Destiny**.
- Particle A <u>material</u> sub-<u>space</u> comprising a <u>persistent</u> combination of <u>identifying charge</u>s that are em<u>bodied</u> as a single <u>operand</u>.
- Past The <u>temporal</u> portion of the <u>world expressed</u> by an <u>unmanifest observer</u> that its immediate <u>manifest</u> predecessor is not <u>experiencing</u>. Also see Future, History, Present.
- Patience A <u>conscious body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of its <u>equanimity</u>.
- **Peace** A <u>mental incarnation</u>'s <u>experience</u> of <u>harmony</u> among its <u>body</u>'s <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, and <u>aspirations</u>.
- **Perfect symmetry** The primal nothingness, em<u>bodied</u> as the foundational in<u>distinguishability</u> of all <u>conceivable possibilities</u>,

and <u>identified</u> as their <u>transformation</u>al invariance. Also see **Complete self-awareness, Real mind, Reality**.

- Persistent The tendency of an <u>effect</u> to continuously recur within an <u>observe</u>r-related <u>sequence</u> of <u>tangible metrical spaces</u>. The <u>categorization</u> of <u>noumena</u> whose <u>expressions</u> are continuously recurring <u>effects</u>.
- Person Any of the constituents of an <u>inherently conscious</u> observer's <u>subjective identity</u>, who have <u>capacities</u>, <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intentions</u>, <u>aspirations</u>, and <u>memories</u> in common. A <u>mental</u> <u>manifestation</u> that is analogous to Kant's empirical ego.
- Perspective A <u>conscious being</u>'s <u>knowledge</u> of its <u>world</u>.
- Phenomenon A <u>body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of an <u>essence</u> within its <u>environment</u>. Also see Appearance, Essence, Noumenon.
- Philosophy The practice that works to identify truth, and explain reality, by developing sound arguments that draw logical conclusions from rational premises, derived from intuitive ideas regarding the human condition. The rational facts and true wisdom revealed by this practice.
- Physicalism The <u>hypothesis</u> that <u>reality</u> is an <u>objective</u> <u>tangible domain</u> comprising all <u>manifest matter</u>, <u>energy</u>, <u>life</u>, <u>minds</u>, and any <u>effects</u> thereof that <u>emerge</u> within it.

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- Pleasure Any <u>incarnation</u>'s fulfilled <u>experience</u> of a lack of <u>desire</u> for <u>change</u>, which is its <u>body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of a decrease in its <u>vital stress</u>. Also see Happiness.
- **Possible** The <u>identification</u> of the totality of <u>reality</u>, or the <u>categorization</u> of any <u>conceivable being</u> that can <u>manifest</u> within an observed world.
- **Practice** A recurring <u>expression</u> of <u>will</u>.
- **Predictability** The <u>categorizing</u> regularity of any <u>metrical</u>ly or <u>causally recurring sequence</u>.
- Present The <u>temporal</u> portion of the <u>world expressed</u> by an <u>unmanifest observer</u> that its immediate <u>manifest</u> predecessor is <u>experiencing</u>. Also see Future, Past.
- Proof The logical argument that justifies the identification of an idea as fact.
- **Purpose** Each <u>observed</u> <u>being</u>'s contribution to its <u>conscious</u> <u>observers' growth</u> toward <u>complete self-awareness</u>.
- Quantum The smallest <u>degree</u> that can be <u>operated</u> upon within a given <u>metrical space</u>.
- Random The <u>categorization</u> of every succession of <u>manifestations</u> that is not <u>symmetric</u>ally aligned with any <u>possible countable or recurring sequence</u>.
- Rational metaphysics The <u>identifying categorization</u> of any <u>philosophical framework</u> based on the principle that each

<u>conceivable</u> <u>unique</u> <u>observer</u> within the <u>perfect</u> <u>symmetry</u>, em<u>bodies</u> a hidden <u>asymmetry</u> that is <u>express</u>ed in the <u>domain</u> it <u>observes</u>, through an <u>existential</u> or <u>essential</u> <u>reflection</u>. Any <u>logical</u> synthetic reasoning that generates a priori <u>existential</u> knowledge.

- Rationalism The practice that intends to identify truth, by transforming the information that identifies a mystery into knowledge that explains it, through an analysis of it in the context of an epistemological framework.
- Real mind The <u>true identity</u> of each <u>asymmetric mind</u>, which its pursuit of <u>complete self-awareness</u> ultimately reveals. The <u>noumenon</u> that is analogous to Hegel's Absolute <u>Spirit</u>. Also see Complete self-awareness, Perfect symmetry, Reality.
- Reality The <u>complete</u> unification of any <u>conceivable essence</u> and its <u>essential complement</u>, which reveals the <u>perfect</u> <u>symmetry</u> that <u>transcends</u> <u>existence</u>. Also see Complete selfawareness, Perfect symmetry, Real mind.
- Reflection (essential) The <u>manifestation uniqueness operator</u> through which each <u>objective identity express</u>es its differentiation from the <u>phenomenal</u> <u>world</u>—its perfect <u>complement</u>—and whose inverse merges them to reveal <u>reality</u>. The fundamental premise of <u>modal idealism</u>.

- Reflection (existential) The foundational <u>uniqueness operator</u> through which each <u>inexistential identity express</u>es its differentiation from existence—its perfect <u>complement</u>—and whose inverse merges them to reveal the <u>perfect symmetry</u>. The fundamental premise of <u>Dark Rationalism</u>.
- Religion Any shared system of <u>belief</u>s and <u>rituals</u> that <u>aspires</u> to generate or sustain <u>equanimity</u>.
- **Responsibility** The <u>categorization</u> of the <u>effects</u> of a <u>mental</u> <u>manifestation</u>'s pursuit of its <u>internal</u>ly-generated <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intention</u>s, and <u>aspiration</u>s.
- **Responsible agency** A <u>conscious observe</u>r's <u>identification</u> of a <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>work</u> as <u>causally shaping their world</u>.
- Ritual Any practice that is an expression of the intention to reinforce a shared belief or personal value. Also see Habit, Meditation.
- Rotation Any <u>operation</u> that <u>expresses</u> a uniform, actual <u>change</u> in an <u>operand</u>'s <u>orientation</u> with respect to all other <u>beings</u> within the <u>space</u> they share. Also see **Translation**.
- Sacred Any <u>manifestation</u> that is <u>identified</u> as <u>existing</u> in <u>harmony</u> with the <u>will</u> that shaped its <u>world</u>.
- Sadness A mental incarnation's experience of sorrow.
- Science The <u>practice</u> that <u>works</u> to <u>identify</u> <u>truth</u>, and <u>explain</u> <u>reality</u>, through the application of quantitative speculation to

<u>intuitive</u> <u>idea</u>s, to develop <u>theories</u> that map recurring <u>indeterminacies</u> to <u>metrical sequence</u>s, and empirically confirms the <u>symmetry</u> of their alignment, by using the latter to <u>predict</u> or retrodict the former. The <u>theories</u> that are <u>identified</u> by this <u>practice</u>.

- Self-awareness A <u>mind</u>'s self-<u>identification</u>, whose <u>completeness</u> is hidden from it by its <u>attribution</u> of <u>uniqueness</u> to itself.
- Self-perpetuity The <u>environmental immortality</u> that is the ultimate <u>intention</u> of <u>life</u>'s <u>adaptive work</u> to survive.
- Separation The relationship between the members of <u>categories identified</u> as mutually exclusive.
- Sequence A <u>domain</u> of either predictably or <u>random</u>ly aligned <u>manifestation</u>s.
- Sin The <u>moral categorization</u> of <u>practices</u> that prioritize the pursuit of <u>imperatives</u> and <u>intentions</u> over their <u>transcendence</u>, and therefore prolong the <u>suffering</u> in the <u>world</u>.
- Skepticism The <u>awareness</u> of the <u>separation</u> between <u>belief</u> and <u>truth</u>. Systemic <u>doubt</u>. Also see **Doubt**.
- Sorrow A <u>mental body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of its <u>identified</u> <u>separation</u> from that with which it <u>needs</u> or <u>desires</u> to <u>connect</u>.
- Soul The <u>inherently conscious objective identity</u> that spans the <u>sequence</u> of distinct <u>mental manifestations</u> that constitute its

<u>subjective identity</u>. Any <u>conscious spirit</u> that is also em<u>bodied</u> as a <u>manifestation</u> within the <u>world</u> it shapes. Also see **Objective identity**, **Spirit**.

- Space Any <u>manifest domain</u> in which an <u>asymmetry</u> can be <u>identified</u>. Also see Category.
- Space (causal) The configuration of inertial <u>distances</u> separating the <u>manifestations</u> within a <u>tangible domain</u>, that <u>express</u> its <u>causal bodies</u>' applications of their <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental mass</u>es to each other. The configuration of <u>dynamic distances separating</u> successive instances of each <u>causal body</u> within distinct <u>observer-sequenced</u>, <u>tangible domains</u> that are <u>expressions</u> of their mutual applications of their <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u> and mental energies to each other.
- **Spirit** Any <u>noumenal entity</u> that is em<u>bodied</u> as sustained or recurring cooperation among causal manifestations.
- Spirituality Any system of <u>beliefs</u> and <u>practices</u> that <u>aspires</u> to generate <u>persistent equanimity</u>, and <u>explain reality</u>, using <u>wisdom</u> derived from the <u>noumenal</u> coherence underlying sustained or recurring cooperation among <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental manifestation</u>s. The <u>wisdom</u> revealed by such a system.
- **Stress** Any <u>manifestation</u>'s <u>imperatives</u> and <u>intention</u>s that are in opposition with each other, or with its <u>aspirations</u>.

- Subjective The <u>categorization</u> of any <u>manifestation</u> <u>identified</u> as having <u>world</u>wide <u>identity</u> variability.
- Subjective identity The <u>sequence</u> of predecessor em<u>bodiments</u> of an <u>inherently conscious</u> <u>observer</u>'s self-<u>identification</u> as a <u>manifest mind</u> with a distinct <u>history</u>.
- Suffering A <u>mental incarnation</u>'s <u>experience</u> of negative <u>effects</u> of the <u>persistence</u> of its <u>body</u>'s <u>separation</u> from that with which it <u>needs</u>, <u>desires</u>, or <u>aspires</u> to <u>connect</u>. Also see Evil.
- Symmetry domain Any collection of <u>entities</u> that are <u>identified</u> as in<u>distinguishable</u> with respect to the <u>emergent</u> <u>attributes</u> of any <u>asymmetry domain</u> within it.
- Tangible The <u>categorization</u> of any <u>metrical manifestation</u>'s <u>attributes</u> that em<u>body</u> its <u>imperatives</u>, and so can be <u>identified</u> as <u>causes</u> or <u>effects</u> within its <u>world</u>. Any <u>space</u> containing such <u>manifestations</u>.
- Technology <u>Effects</u> that are <u>expressions</u> of <u>engineering</u>. Also see Engineering.
- **Temporal symmetry** The <u>categorization</u> of any <u>material space</u> in which there is no <u>usable energy</u>.
- **Temporalize** To <u>identify</u> a <u>metrical manifestation</u> as residing within a <u>tangible</u> gradient of <u>causal indeterminacies</u>, where it em<u>bodies imperatives</u> to <u>use energy</u> to <u>translate</u> toward a <u>world</u> in <u>temporal symmetry</u>.

- Theism The <u>belief</u> in the <u>existence</u> of eternal <u>conscious</u> <u>noumena</u> that <u>caused</u> the <u>phenomenal</u> <u>world</u>, and can <u>express</u> themselves in <u>effects</u> there.
- Theology The practice that aspires to explain our origin, purpose, and destiny in the context of the foundational noumenon that facilitates all temporal, vital, and mental cooperation; based on the mystical texts and commentaries that are identified as their writers' experiences of its revelations.
- Theory A falsifiable <u>fact</u>.
- Thoughts The embodiments of a mental manifestation's intuitions, imperatives, intentions, aspirations, and memories, as dynamic mental operators translating conscious operands between the mental spaces sequenced by its objective identity. Mental energy.
- Time The <u>transformations</u> of the <u>observer-sequenced tangible</u> <u>metrical spaces</u> that each contain the <u>matter</u> of a <u>manifestation</u>, to which their <u>objective observer</u> has <u>attributed</u> its <u>identity</u>. The <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental indeterminacies separating</u> instances of the same <u>tangible body</u>, which is <u>identified</u> as an <u>expression</u> of <u>unmanifest possibilities</u> that <u>causally</u> shapes particular <u>manifest certainties</u>. Also see Material space.

- Transcendence The <u>identification</u> of an <u>entity</u> as having left a given <u>asymmetry domain</u>, for an encompassing <u>symmetry</u> <u>domain</u>. The revelation of a <u>symmetry</u>. Also see Emergence.
- Transformation The <u>material</u> record of any <u>operation</u> that traverses the <u>indeterminacies</u> <u>separating</u> <u>tangible</u> <u>metrical</u> <u>spaces</u>, by <u>translating</u> the <u>identity</u> of its <u>operands</u> through <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, and <u>mental space</u>.
- **Translation** Any <u>operation</u> that <u>express</u>es a non-uniform, actual <u>change</u> in an <u>operand</u>'s <u>orientation</u> with respect to all other <u>being</u>s within the <u>space</u> they share. Also see **Rotation**.
- Translation (mental) A <u>body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of its <u>mental</u> <u>incarnation</u> through the <u>imperative</u>, <u>intention</u>al, and <u>aspiration</u>al stages of <u>consciousness</u> to a <u>domain</u> of pure <u>bliss</u>.
- Translation (temporal) A <u>body</u>'s <u>expression</u> of its t<u>emporal</u> <u>incarnation</u> through the <u>fields</u> of other <u>charged bodies</u>, toward a <u>world</u> in <u>temporal symmetry</u>, which resides beyond all such <u>fields</u>.
- Translation (vital) A body's recurring expression of its vital incarnation through the stages of mortality—inception, symbiosis, individuation, maturation, reproduction, senescence, and expiration—toward a world in which it resides beyond the reach of <u>death</u>.

- Truth An <u>objective identity</u>'s <u>knowledge</u> of an <u>observed</u> <u>essence</u> within its <u>world</u>. All <u>objective knowledge</u> of a <u>world</u>. Also see Appearance, Essence, Phenomenon.
- Understanding The process through which a <u>mental</u> manifestation internalizes knowledge of beings, by transforming its <u>separation</u> from them into a <u>connection</u>, with the <u>intention</u> of decreasing its <u>ignorance</u>. The <u>transformation</u> of <u>curiosity</u> about a <u>domain</u> into an appreciation of its <u>beauty</u>.
- Uniqueness The boundary of an <u>entity</u> that differentiates it from its <u>complement</u>. The foundational <u>necessity</u> of the <u>existence</u> of the <u>complementary domain</u> <u>observed</u> by an <u>inexistential entity</u>.
- Universal consciousness The <u>inexistential identity</u> that is shared by every <u>conceivable asymmetric mind</u>, and so is the source of all <u>meaning</u> in <u>reality</u>. The <u>noumenon</u> that shapes the <u>categories</u> of Kant's <u>transcendental imagination</u>, to form the collective unconscious. Also see Collective unconscious.
- Universe A domain of worlds that are temporally, vitally, and mentally entangled through the history-merging intersection of their observers' objective identities.
- Unmanifest The <u>identification</u> of any <u>noumenon</u>, residing beyond the <u>manifest world</u> it shapes through <u>essential reflection</u>.

- Usable energy The <u>capacity</u> to shape <u>indeterminacies</u> within a <u>world</u>; which decreases with each <u>caused change experienced</u> by a <u>temporal</u>, <u>vital</u>, or <u>mental incarnation</u> there, and is either sustained or increased by each <u>change</u> that <u>emerges</u>, without an <u>identifiable cause</u>, from its <u>observer</u>'s <u>objective identity</u>. The basis of all <u>imperatives</u>, <u>intention</u>s, and <u>aspiration</u>s.
- Utility The <u>degree</u> to which a <u>manifestation</u> is aligned with all of the <u>geodesics</u> in a <u>world</u>.
- Value (external) A <u>conscious observer</u>'s <u>identification</u> of the <u>utility</u> of a <u>being</u>, which em<u>bodies</u> its worth to other <u>observers</u>.
- Values (personal) The intersection of the internally-generated imperatives, intentions, or aspirations of a mental manifestation. Mental charge.
- Vengeance The <u>identifying categorization</u> of any <u>intention</u> to increase a <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>separation</u> from that with which it <u>needs</u> or <u>desires</u> to <u>connect</u>; as a consequence of it having been <u>identified</u> as unjustifiably increasing another <u>mental manifestation</u>'s <u>separation</u> from that with which it <u>needs</u> or <u>desires</u> to <u>connect</u>. Also see **Justice**.
- Velocity The <u>material expression</u> of the angle between the directions of actual <u>translation</u>—through <u>time</u>—of an inertial <u>observer</u> and an <u>observed manifestation</u>.

- Vitalize To <u>attribute</u> to a <u>temporal body</u>, a self-sustaining <u>intention</u> to <u>predictably</u> diverge from its <u>temporal geodesic</u>, in an <u>adaptive</u> pursuit of <u>self-perpetuity</u>.
- Wave The <u>world</u>-spanning, probability distribution of a given <u>manifest particle</u>'s state that resides among the <u>unmanifest</u> <u>indeterminacies</u> of its <u>observer</u>'s <u>objective identity</u>.
- Will The <u>mental capacity</u> to shape <u>effects</u>.
- Wisdom The <u>symmetric connections</u> that extend beyond the objective knowledge of a given world, to explain reality.
- Work The pursuit of an <u>imperative</u>, <u>intention</u>, or <u>aspiration</u>.
- World The portion of the <u>complement</u> of an <u>inexistential</u> <u>identity</u> that its <u>objective identity</u> <u>externalizes</u>—and shapes to reflect the <u>internalized</u> portion—as its <u>domain</u> of <u>manifest</u> <u>certainties</u>.

Conclusion

The primary objective of this glossary to make the theorists in each existential field, aware that their terms of art have meanings in the other fields. It represents a potential first step—in a unified language—toward the syncretizing of philosophy, science, theism, and spirituality. The predictable lack of agreement on these definitions may at first seem to imply that this is a step backward. However, if this disagreement produces work toward a consensus on the meaning of these terms, that will be a step in the right direction.

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
