This volume collects papers presented on two occasions: the Tilburg-Groningen conference ‘Women in the History of Analytic Philosophy’ and the Autumn School of the Dutch Research School of Philosophy (Onderzoeksschool Wijsbegeerte, OZSW) ‘Beyond the Canon: Unexplored Topics and Forgotten Thinkers’. Both events took place at Tilburg University from October 25 to 27, 2019. They were attended by senior scholars as well as students at the beginning of their career with an interest in the philosophical canon, especially in the role that female philosophers played at the dawn of analytic philosophy.

Three papers in this volume were presented elsewhere in The Netherlands. Naomi Kloosterboer’s contribution on Elizabeth Anscombe and Sander Verhaegh’s paper on Susanne Langer were read in Amsterdam on November 21, 2019, at the workshop ‘Women in Parenthesis’ of *CLUE+*, the Research Institute for Culture, Cognition, History and Heritage of the Free University (organized by Kloosterboer and Catarina Dutilh Novaes). The chapter on Grete Hermann by Michael Cuffaro is based on his talk for the Department of Theoretical Philosophy at the University of Groningen on February 19, 2020.
